The Pilgrimage weekend is only the beginning. What you learn and share during this time will hopefully be taken back and put into practice in your congregation and community.

You will be supported by many others who attended previous pilgrimages or attended with you. You are encouraged to join a small group (renewal group) that meets regularly to affirm one another and to share the Christian life of grace. These group activities inspire, challenge, and encourage Christian action in your home, church and community. Larger groups statewide may also meet during the year for fellowship and encouragement.

Christian life is a journey directed by God. God is shaping us, sharpening us, calling us to live for him. We are meant to walk our path with others, our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Pilgrimage is designed to energize, strengthen, inform and enlighten your faith by providing opportunities to experience God in a loving community in order to more effectively live out your faith and express love to others in your personal spheres of influence: your home, work, church, social environments and throughout your community and the world.

Presbyterian Pilgrimage is a three-day spiritual retreat designed to foster and support an individual's foundation and commitment to living the Christian life. This is accomplished in dialogue with pastors and lay people covering topics such as Grace, Sacraments, Obstacles to the life in grace, Importance of Bible study, Christian action and Christian community. The weekend also includes small group discussions, sharing, communion, worship, singing, laughter, and prayer.

The **Pilgrimage** weekend offers itself as part of the life journey of the participant. It is neither the beginning nor the end of one's faith journey. It is neither essential to, nor exclusive of, the other parts of one's faith journey. It is one way of growing in faith and experiencing God's love and grace.

Give God a chance to speak to you, to heal your hurts, deepen your relationship with Him, give you support and let you experience God's amazing love and grace.

Presbyterian Pilgrimage is designed for individuals with a professing faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Participants may be Presbyterian or members of other denominations. A Pilgrimage is not designed to convert anyone to Christianity. The goal is to encourage Christians, to help them grow in their lives of faith, and increase both their awareness of grace and desire to serve Christ in His church and the world. A staff of lay people and pastors who have previously attended a pilgrimage make up the team who serves the participants in every way.



At **Pilgrimage**, you will have an opportunity to listen and learn, to relax free from the distractions of the world, and to reflect on your own faith and relationship with God.

Both singles and couples are welcome to attend. Pilgrimage is an *individual* experience, but married couples are encouraged to attend together to share the joy of the experience. However, spouses will *not* be roommates or in the same small group.

Costs are kept to a minimum and cover lodging and meals. Partial scholarships are available for those who could not otherwise attend. Please do not let cost be an obstacle.

Deposits cannot be refunded if cancellation occurs within 30 days of the weekend retreat, but they can be applied to a future Pilgrimage.
